



CEO Message

Two years ago, the Chamber began with ambitious goals to bring members excellent opportunities for networking, business education, and increased engagement. A number of Lunch Series Luncheons, local speakers for PA@5, the State of the City Address, and our annual Legacy Brunch were hosted. In December 2019, to encourage people to 'shop local', we ran Christmas giveaway contests.

We reached out to City Council, voicing concerns about business taxation, and a new bylaw which intended to compel business owners to charge customers for paper bags. On these fronts, Council amended the paper/plastic bag bylaw to the benefit of business owners and defeated the motion to create new sub-classes in commercial taxes.

In March 2020, who could have imagined a pandemic would slow us down. Responding to it meant our office became busier than ever, assisting businesses to navigate through the confusion of new government programs. We provided resources on our website and facilitated online workshops where business owners could speak one on one with key government officials on a regular basis as the situation evolved.

We witnessed great resiliency from local businesses which have literally re-invented themselves 'on the fly', to maintain their customer base and stay in business. Many businesses discovered how well 'working from home' could work. Others created online stores to order from, and/or offered 'curbside pickup'. Like everyone else, the Chamber is working on creative ways to continue to deliver our services, and have introduced new tools to help promote local business to local consumers.

In the last two years, we have digitized information about the Chamber and opportunities the Prince Albert district offers through social media and a new website. Our message now reaches the world market. This includes the popular 'Curbside Conversations', hosted on the Prince Albert Chamber YouTube channel, where members talk about what's happening with their business.


As December 2020 approached, the Chamber collaborated with City of Prince Albert, Prince Albert Downtown Business Improvement District and Prince Albert Regional Economic Development Alliance to create the #ShopLocalYPA movement. Retailers reported a definite response to supporting local.

Like many other organizations, our signature event in 2020 was postponed. Recipients of the 2020 Samuel McLeod Awards were presented their awards in a hybrid gala, livestreamed from the E. A. Rawlinson Centre Feb 25th, 2021.


